Syna Lao, Cambodia

Syna was born in a Buddhist, middle class family, where she once lived and experienced the luxury life of having people serve her every need. Then in 1973 a tragedy took place, her father was reported missing. Life became much worse in 1975 when communists took over Cambodia, where over 2 million lives were killed. During the Killing Field regime, she was separated from her family and lived in a concentration camp for three years. In 1979 she was reunited with family. In 1980 she met Christ. It was after this time that God started calling Syna to himself and to return to Cambodia and love the Cambodian people, her own people.

Esther Yim, Mongolia

Esther was born in Seoul, South Korea. She attended Columbia College in South Carolina where she majored in International Politics. In 1991 she attended Alliance Theological Seminary and received a Master of Professional in Mission. She later worked at The Board of Education in New York City, served with Libenzell mission in Micronesia and now working in the Mongolia field.

Nikki Chung, Hong Kong China

Nikki was born and raised in Hong Kong and came to New York with her family when she was 15 years old. She accepted Jesus when she was in junior college. James and Nikki were married after college and moved to Nyack where James started seminary at ATS. Nikki joined a 7 week short-term mission trip to Venezuela in the summer of 1994 and the Lord confirmed the burden of missions in her heart. She then completed the three years Lay Leadership Program of the Alliance in 1998 and was then sent to Sao Paulo, Brazil in 2000 to minister among the Chinese immigrants. She then came back to New York for home assignment in 2006 and was deployed to China in July of 2007. Nikki and James have three children, Jonathan (14), Timothy (12) and Joanna (10).
